This board will meet monthly to help shape the activities and vision for the borough, exploring fresh, relevant ways to engage young people effectively

Youth Board Objectives

- Developing and delivering awareness of the events and activities in the borough
- Contributing ideas for projects and resources
- Reviewing the borough's activities and events
- Planning, designing and executing workshops and events for children and young people
- Discussing current events and policies happening in the Youth Service sector

Youth Board Member Expectations

- The last Thursday every month in Hammersmith between 5:30pm-8:00pm.
- Volunteer at public events to promote Hammersmith and Fulham's Children and Young People Services
- You may be asked to write blog posts, or be part of steering groups for specific projects
- Attend Quality Assurance meetings at youth groups, family hubs and events.

Youth Board Member Benefits

Two members of the LMP Action team support the Youth Board by running the interactive and creative meetings and planning the year's activities. They will be available during your time on the Youth Board to ensure you get the most out of volunteering with us.

At LMP Action we believe in the importance of giving back to those who volunteer their time with us. You will be given a full induction to the Youth Board so that you understand our work and your role as a Youth Board member. As an active member of the youth board, you will be offered opportunities and rewards, such as:

- Free masterclasses from external organisations
- Free training sessions
- Free tickets to theatre productions, exhibitions and other public events

- Opportunities to build your CV through campaigning, masterclasses, events and work experience.

To make sure we're supporting our Youth Board members, we carry out a surveys to better understand what you wish to gain from the Youth Board, and endeavour to offer opportunities to develop in ways that will support your future ambitions.

Youth Board Eligibility

- Applicants must be between the ages of 11-16 and attend secondary school.
- Applicants must live, go to school, or be involved in a youth programme within the borough of Hammersmith and Fulham
- Applicants must commit to regular Youth Board meetings, typically held once a month, along with additional planning sessions and events as needed.
- Application should demonstrate an interest in community services, youth advocacy and making a positive impact on young people in the borough.

Youth Board Application Process

- Applications close on Friday 3rd January
- Applications review and successful candidates appointed by Friday 10th January
- First meeting to taken place on Thursday 30th January
